Dear friends,

In Southwerk at the Tabard as I lay
Redy to wenden on my pilgrimage
To Caunterbury with ful devout corage,
At night was come in-to that hostelrye
Wel nyne and twenty in a compaignye,
Of sondry folk, by aventure y-falle
In felawshipe, and pilgrims were they alle,
That toward Caunterbury wolden ryde;

I admit to stretching the imagination a little! I confess that I wasn't at the Tabard Inn in Southwark, and I apologise to Geoffrey Chaucer (c1340-1400) for borrowing part of the Prologue to the Canterbury Tales, but I thought that people might like to hear some reflections of the parish trip to Canterbury a few weeks ago.

We set off at a fairly early hour from Whiteman's Green and the skies were an almost cloudless blue, remaining so for the whole day. We made extraordinarily good time, arriving in the city before 10.00am.and although we were slightly further from the cathedral than expected, the whole group made a leisurely walk alongside the River Stour and into the narrow streets of the city.

The entrance to the cathedral close is through Christ Church Gate, a Perpendicular gate built by one of the last priors of Canterbury in the early 1500s, and on entering one can take in virtually the whole length (nearly 600 feet) of the Cathedral and Metropolitical Church of Christ – the mother church of the world-wide Anglican Communion.

The arrival of St Augustine of Canterbury, sent at the behest of Pope Gregory the Great to proclaim the Gospel, marked the cathedral's foundation in 598

and it remained a monastic church for the best part of 1,000 years until Henry VIII's reforms. During that period, it became an extraordinary focus for the religious and political life of the nation. Here are buried Henry IV and Edward Plantagenet, the Black Prince. Perhaps most evocatively, the north transept was the site of the martyrdom of Thomas Becket on 29th December 1170. His stand against the political power of Henry II led his tomb to become one of the greatest pilgrimage sites in Europe and his feast day is still celebrated by the whole Western Church on that date.

We were fortunate to be able to celebrate a Eucharist together in the Jesus Chapel – the easternmost part of the crypt, formed under the Corona or Becket's Crown- a light-flooded space- and there was the opportunity to immerse oneself in the quietude of a sacred space, made holy by the prayers of pilgrims through the centuries. The cathedral is a busy place with numerous tourists, yet it was still possible to take in that sense of God's presence in people's lives which in all sorts of ways has shaped and formed the building and all it contains and stands for. I hope that people felt as I did, that having the opportunity to pray for our own church and community of Cuckfield was an integral and important part of a very special day.

suggested 7 goats, 2 donkeys and 2 donkey ploughs should be purchased and the rest of the money to whatever else was needed most. Thank you to all who supported me.





SAMARA'S AID UPDATE

Dear friends

There has been a lot of continued fighting in the area where we are opening Eliana Hospital, our third in Syria. ISIS have not managed to advance further since my last update but are still so close, being just 1-2 km away. This is a predominantly Christian area, which has also been hosting a large number of displaced Muslim families. They do not have any military support there and the men from this city are now trying to protect their homes themselves.

Our medical teams are dealing with a lot of dead bodies and injuries, many of them caused by rockets. There are a lot of casualties with serious wounds and burns and the team are all volunteers, serving our brothers and sisters because of their compassion and love.

The lives of our team are in great danger there because the fighting is so close now, yet they have chosen to stay and help the people being injured in this relentless conflict. Some of the families of our teams have been evacuated to a safer area, and

some have stayed, saying that if the husband/father is staying and might die, then they will stay and die with them. I can't even imagine being faced with this kind of decision.

There is a very high level of fear in this area, and among our team today, as the source of the conflict is so close, and the aggressors show no mercy to anyone. The need for a fully functioning emergency hospital is urgent right now. It can't wait. Our team on the ground is working flat out to try to establish this hospital as quickly as possible, as there is no other hospital in this city that is functioning. It seems that even the private hospitals in this area have closed because the owners have fled.

Too many people will die without a hospital, driving more and more families into poverty. We are having to double our budget to ensure that we can buy the equipment needed and open Eliana as quickly as possible. It isn't easy, because not many are willing to travel to this area even to deliver the equipment.

Please continue to pray for the safety of our team working there as the fighting is so close and they are at great risk. The persecuted Christians of Iraq - Yasser's story

"We met with them (the Christians) in the presence of a representative of the Caliph al-Baghdadi. He offered the chance for them to convert to Islam. If you don't accept this, you can pay non-Muslim tax (Jizya), according to the Quran. If you don't accept this, there is nothing left between us but killing and fighting." Abu Abdula (Islamic State Judge), Raqqa

Below is the testimony of Yasser, an Iraqi Christian from Baghdad. His story is typical of the many people we are helping - followers of Yesua who have been terrorised and displaced by sectarian violence.

Yasser's Story

Yasser was born and lived in Baghdad. He worked as a welder, a job he did to provide for his two small children. In July 2014 an anonymous note arrived at Yasser's place of work, followed by a phone call. Both made clear that Yasser and his family were not safe.

"I had no choice. My daughter was 4 years old and my son was 8 months old. I feared for their lives so I took them to Sulaymaniyah, a city in the Kurdish region of Iraq. There we lived in a church for one month before moving to Jordan in August 2014."

In Jordan, Yasser was able to get an asylum interview with the UN, hopeful that he and his family would be able to emigrate to the United States. However, this did not happen and Yasser and his family were stuck in Amman without money, food or shelter.

Currently, the Jordanian government will not permit Iraqi refugees to work (only Syrian refugees are able to get work permits). Much of the financial aid given to Jordan by the international community, including the British and American governments, has gone to helping Syrian refugees.

However, thanks to your support, Yasser now has a job assisting at our school in Marka (a suburb south of Amman), where he works as an administrator. We are also able to provide money for rent so that he and his family have a roof over their heads, as well as youchers for food.

COMMA - PERFECTLY PUNCTUATED BY MICHAEL BLENCOWE PEOPLE & WILDLIFE OFFICER AT THE SUSSEX WILDLIFE TRUST

Ding, ding. Last orders at the butterfly bar. The party is over. All summer the blues, whites, browns, skippers, hairstreaks and all our other butterflies have mated in the meadows and fornicated in our flower beds. The results of this butterfly bonding will pass the winter as eggs, caterpillars and chrysalises. Even those butterflies tough enough to endure the winter as adults will have turned in early to get a good six months sleep. But there's still one species left knocking back the nectar until the bitter end.

The comma is one ragged looking butterfly – it is unlike any other British species. With its jagged-edged wings it looks like it's been busy brawling with a bird's beak. The wings glow the fiery orange of hell. In France the butterfly's devilish good looks have earned it the name Robert Le Diablo – Robert the Devil.

But this angular attire is perfect for a butterfly that will be spending the winter hidden amongst dark dead leaves. Its crinkle-cut wings are dark underneath and when it closes them the comma chameleon vanishes. Yet the centre of this dark facade is punctured by a punctuation mark – a small silver 'c', the comma that gives the butterfly its English name. In America a similar looking butterfly has a comma and a dot and is called the question mark.

In October you'll still find the commas across Sussex stocking up on sugars from late-flowering ivy or rotting fruits in preparation for its winter-long big sleep. It's not always been this way. Certainly many, many years ago the comma was widespread across Sussex but by the 1820s the comma had mysteriously vanished from most of England. Lugubrious lepidopterists mourned 'the butterfly of our youth has left us for good and all'. The decline in England's hop industry must have had an effect along with new techniques of bine-burning and washing the crops with insecticides. In the 1930s an increase in comma sightings marked the start of the butterfly's re-conquest of England. This time, with hardly any hops left to munch, the comma grasped the nettle as the main food plant for its caterpillar. Now the butterfly is regularly being seen across Scotland too. The comma's comeback continues.

OCTOBER GARDEN NOTES

As the children return to school, so the sunshine continues with some very warm days.

It's been a fairly good summer apart from a week of unsettled weather at the beginning of August. No parched ground, but grass did slow up as did the weeds, momentarily, with lack of rain. Rust appeared on our beans and mildew on the courgettes but both have cropped well. For those with fruit, harvesting of plums, apples and pears, autumn raspberries and quinces should be almost complete. Pumpkins, squashes, marrows and remaining potatoes should also be harvested as soon as possible before slugs, frosts and vermin help themselves.

October is tidy-up time: hedge cutting of all types - leylandii, privet, hawthorn, beech, holly, yew - any you haven't yet tackled; prune and tie in climbers - roses, honeysuckle, jasmine, etc., before the autumn winds blow fiercely. Continue dead-heading herbaceous plants as they finish flowering and turn brown, composting what you can, along with all the leaves falling. Buddleias, penstemons and taller shrubs /woody herbaceous that aren't normally pruned until spring are best reduced by a third to avoid wind damage. Take down bean poles and burn bean haulms before November, especially if infected with rust, which appeared here in August. Chop up sweetcorn stems and use at the base of a new compost heap (good aeration). Plant bulbs you have bought, remembering that, as a general rule of thumb, the height of the bulb (base to tip) is the amount of soil there should be on top of them. Some bulbs aren't that fussy (narcissi) but the smaller ones can be.

If squirrels/mice are a nuisance, try some of the deterrents (wire, rags soaked in Olbas Oil, sonic emitters, traps etc., etc. !!)

Empty and clean out pots, tubs and baskets when summer bedding has died or gone past its best, before replanting with bulbs, pansies and other autumn bedding. October is a good time to buy shrubs and trees - nature should do the watering for you after an initial soak with a watering can. Lawns can be scarified and treated for moss, top-dressing added where needed on bare patches. and sunken areas filled in. If sowing grass seed, don't leave later than early October, as germination is not reliable once ground temperatures drop too low.

Harvest festival time is upon us, so vegetable and fruit growers in particular give thanks to God for the abundance we enjoy in this country, and pray for those who are less fortunate around the globe.




