You may have read my article in the church magazine about this Feast day of Mary. I vividly remember visiting the Abbey of Rohr in Bavaria (now a parish church) on this day a few years ago. The air was still heavy with fragrant incense, and there above the altar was the Asam brothers' great reredos of the Assumption of Mary. Her baroque sarcophagus open, and the apostles, holding great candles looking in amazement and alarm as Mary is assumed into heaven on her death! Of course it is all non-scriptural, yet this image is designed to lift one's heart heavenward with Mary - that is its true power. Mary allowed herself to become a vessel of grace in bearing the Saviour. This is our call too - we can have no greater example of Christian discipleship. Thus we live lives ever on that ascent towards the knowledge of God's love for each one of us.
