# Our responsibilities:

Checking your qualification to be married at Holy Trinity

You have a right to be married at Holy Trinity if:

Either of you is resident in the parish of Cuckfield **or** 

Either one of you is on the electoral roll of the parish of Cuckfield (to be on the electoral roll, you must worship regularly at the church for at least six months)

or

Either of you has a qualifying connection with the parish.

You will receive a form explaining the qualifications allowable and this will need to be completed and returned to allow us to process your application. Documentary evidence of qualification will need to be provided.

#### Banns of Marriage:

These are a legal requirement and must be read in Holy Trinity by the Vicar on three consecutive Sundays at the main 9.45 service in the three month period leading up to your wedding. If you live in another parish or parishes, you must also have them read there. It is **your** responsibility to contact and meet with the Vicar(s) involved, and we will need the certificate of proof which they will provide (a fee is payable for this). We are unable to proceed with the wedding without receiving this certificate.

#### Interviews:

The first stage in your marriage preparation starts with an interview with the Vicar, where you will be informed about the Marriage Work shop—a valuable course we provide about married life for all of the couples who intend to marry in Holy Trinity. There will also be a marriage preparation meeting. At the latter, the Vicar will arrange the rehearsal for your wedding, normally a day or two before the actual service. It is strongly recommended that you attend both. Please note that you will be informed well in advance if the Vicar is unable to officiate at your wedding, and you will be put in touch with the priest taking the service, with the opportunity to meet them.

#### Marriage after divorce:

At Holy Trinity, we marry people who have been divorced; this is not, however, an automatic right. Parish clergy must abide by the House of Bishops' guidelines in these cases. We try to be as welcoming and as accommodating as possible, but if either you or your partner is di vorced, before we can agree to the wedding, we must ask some ques tions about your first marriage. In many cases this is a simple process. We try to be as sensitive as we can be.

# Your responsibilities:

Choosing various aspects to do with the Marriage Service:

#### Music

Choosing the hymns (usually two or three) plus any special music which you will wish to have played as you enter and leave the church, together with music you wish performed at the signing of the registers. Please contact the Parish Office regarding this.

#### Choir

The church choir may be available to sing for the wedding by arrangement, for which there will be a charge. That said, we welcome the involvement of other choirs, singers and musicians for weddings although you will be responsible for organising in this situation. Please liaise with the office on this.

#### **Order of Service Sheet**

This is your own responsibility if you wish to have one. We are able to provide a booklet with the words of the service. If you wish to print the whole service along with the hymns, we are able to send you the text electropically for you to adapt. You will find a skeleton

#### **Notes on music:**

It is possible to have **recorded music** at certain points, but we recommend keeping things 'live,' This gives maximum flexibility on timings, etc., and avoids awkward fades or cuts, or the possibility of an embarrassing overrun or shortfall in the music.

If the choir is booked, the organist will choose an anthem to fit in well with the chosen music, and to suit the number of singers present. Wedding bookings are notified to the choir about eight weeks in advance of the event, Please let us know as soon as possible if you would like the choir to be present.

It is also possible to book professional singers or instrumentalists - perhaps a solo vocalist or quartet to sing during the Signing of the Registers, or a live trumpeter, etc. Please let us know if you would like more details.

The list of pieces on the Menu List is certainly not exhaustive. However, if you choose other music, the we would need to know well in advance. It is important that music chosen 'works' on the organ, and you may be asked to provide the sheet music.

Finally - Holy Trinity has a fine organ and music tradition; we look forward to providing the music for your special day, and the church musicians wish you well in all your preparations, and for the future.

#### Bells

If you wish the bells to be rung at the end of the service, please contact **Jennifer Constable** 

email:jenniferconstable | 100@gmail.com as soon as possible.

There is a fee payable for use of the bells as six to eight people are required to ring them. The wedding duration (usually about 40-45 mins.) is taken into account by the ringers. Please note therefore that **the bride must not be unduly late** for the wedding in case the ringers have to curtail ringing if they are required to ring else where.

#### **Flowers**

The church is unable to provide flowers for your wedding. How ever, if you wish to have arrangements, these may be placed any where within reason within the building (or over the porch door) other than on the altars. Please note that no sticky tape, nails or any other forms of fixture other than ties may be used in the building. If you are having flowers we would be very grateful if you left a pedestal arrangement in the church for our Sunday services; however, all flowers must be removed by the following Wednesday. If there is more than one wedding in the church that day, we will give your contact details of the other couple(s) so that you are able to liaise costs and colours. Please contact the office if you have fur ther queries.

#### **Photography**

We are happy to liaise with any photographer employed to record your wedding. However, they would be expected to be discreet in movement and to reflect the solemnity of this happy occasion. Please note that if the service is filmed, then a licence **may** be required from the Performing Rights Society (02075 805544 or www.prsformusic.com) particularly if you are using recorded music. Please note permission must be gained from both the Vicar and the Organist to have the service videoed or sound recorded. There is also an additional payment applicable to the organist and choir. We are able to livestream your service by arrangement and for a fee, but please note that this may also require a licence.

#### **Parking**

Alas, we are unable to guarantee any parking for the wedding other than that for the bridal car and disabled parking spaces (in the Old School Car Park). Please advise your guests that it is inadvisable to consider parking anywhere within the immediate environs of the church.

#### Confetti

Please advise your guests that confetti may be thrown in the churchyard as long as it is **biodegradable**.

#### Fees

You will receive a separate sheet in regard to the fees.

# Particulars of the wedding:

#### Readings

There must be at least one reading from the Bible at your wedding, because it is taking place in a church and you have chosen a religious ceremony. Some suggestions follow, but if you have a favourite passage of Scripture, then that is absolutely fine. You are also very welcome to have non-Biblical readings (including poems) during the service by agreement with the Vicar.

#### **Wedding Music**

You will need to choose music for three points in the service - the entry of the bridal party, the signing of the registers and the process-sion of the marriage party at the end of the service. You may choose to have recorded music (emailed to the office) for one or more of these, but if you are employing the Director of Music, it makes sense to use the organ as much as possible. You will find more details over leaf. There is usually an opportunity to discuss music with the organist.
