Weekly Reflection...

An enquiry from some non-Jewish seekers (via Philip who, though Galilean, had a Greek name) signalled how soon the impact of Christ's work would spill beyond the immediate confines of Israel within which he had largely worked. Yet he recognized this could be accomplished only through his death; this was precisely why he had come. With his hour of suffering and glory imminent, he accepts the difficult path of the Father's call. His anguish and death would mean life for many; but the principle of life coming only through renunciation, suffering and death applies equally to his followers.

Old Testament Reading

God will make a new covenant with Israel remembering their sin no more

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, 'Know the Lord', for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

New Testament Reading

Christ, a priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek, learned obedience through suffering

So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, 'You are my Son, today I have begotten you'; as he says also in another place, 'You are a priest for ever, according to the order of Melchizedek.'

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Jesus predicts his death and says his time is drawing near

Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour.

'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say- "Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.' He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

Easter Services...

Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Holy Week 25th, 26th 27th March 9.00pm - a serene, reflective service held at night, marking the end of the day with prayers, hymns, and readings, focusing on repentance, reflection, and preparation for the solemnities of Easter, embodying a peaceful contemplation of Christ's Passion and Resurrection.

Maundy Thursday, 28th March - Eucharist of the Last Supper at 8pm: Marks the start of the Triduum, inviting reflection on Christ's sacrifice and our faithfulness, followed by a night vigil until midnight. Please sign up for a ½ hour slot.

Good Friday, 29th March - Reflection at noon: Contemplate Jesus' final words from the cross, with preacher Kevin Carey and Haydn's "Seven Last Words from the Cross" piano sonatas played by

Fearghus Beauchamp. Easter-themed craft activities for families are available at the Old School. Good Friday Liturgy at 2pm: Narrates Christ's Passion, emphasising His love and sacrifice, with an alternative 'Family Praise' service for all ages, followed by refreshments and hot cross buns for all at the Old School.

Holy Saturday, 30th March - Easter Vigil at 8pm: Beginning outside at the brazier, a shortened version of the traditional overnight vigil, recounting God's salvation history leading up to Jesus' resurrection, focusing on the 'light of Christ' and a chance to renew our baptismal vows.

Easter Sunday - Holy Communion at 8am: The beginning of Easter Sunday services.

Parish Eucharist at 9.45am: Celebrates the Easter Gospel and the First Eucharist of Easter, emphasising joy in Christ's resurrection through worship and song and followed by fellowship over cake and a glass of fizz.
