Weekly Reflection...

The climax of the Gospel of the Palms is Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. The city is to become the stage upon which the drama of salvation will be acted out. Psalm 118, with its cry of 'hosanna' ('save us now'), quoted in the Gospel, was traditionally sung in procession to the temple in Jerusalem as a thanksgiving for the King's victory. For us, the church building into which we process today becomes our Jerusalem: the place where in Holy Week we shall celebrate the victory of Christ our King. We have begun a journey and there is no turning back.

The Palm Gospel (Outside)

Mark 11:1-11

Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem

As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and just as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly.'"

They went and found a colt outside in the street, tied at a doorway. As they untied it, some people standing there asked, "What are you doing, untying that colt?" They answered as Jesus had told them to, and the people let them go. When they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks over it, he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, while others spread branches they had cut in the fields. Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted.

Jesus entered Jerusalem and went into the temple courts. He looked around at everything, but since it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the Twelve.

New Testament Reading

Philippians 2.5 -11

Christ emptied himself to die on the cross so every knee should bow and confess him Lord

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death - even death on a cross. Therefore, God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

The Easter Triduum...

Maundy Thursday, 28th March - Eucharist of the Last Supper at 8pm: Marks the start of the Triduum, inviting reflection on Christ's sacrifice and our faithfulness, followed by a night vigil until midnight. Please sign up for a ½ hour slot.

Good Friday, 29th March - Reflection at noon: Contemplate Jesus' final words from the cross, with preacher Kevin Carey and Haydn's "Seven Last Words from the Cross" piano sonatas played by Fearghus Beauchamp. Easter-themed craft activities for families are available at the Old School. Good Friday Liturgy at 2pm: Narrates Christ's Passion, emphasising His love and sacrifice, with an alternative 'Family Praise' service for all ages, followed by refreshments and hot cross buns for all at the Old School.

Holy Saturday, 30th March - Easter Vigil at 8pm: Beginning outside at the brazier, a shortened version of the traditional overnight vigil, recounting God's salvation history leading up to Jesus' resurrection, focusing on the 'light of Christ' and a chance to renew our baptismal vows.

New Service Pattern for Sunday Mornings -After Easter there will be a slightly amended pattern of worship at 9.45 on Sunday. A letter at the back of church explains more. Mon Mar 25th - Holy Week. On this International Day of Remembrance of the Victims of Slavery and the Transatlantic Slave Trade, we remember the devastating, dehumanising trade in people. We find it so hard to forgive, even little offences; yet you teach us to forgive in the face of pain, betrayal and suffering. Help us to forgive each other. We find it hard to see that forgiveness can be granted; yet you show us the way. Help us to accept your forgiveness and see that we can live in hope and love. We ask this in Jesus' name. Amen. From our own parish we pray for the people of Burrell Green. For their health and welcoming, for their wellbeing and joy.

Sat Mar 30th - Soul of Christ, sanctify me, body of Christ , save me, Blood of Christ, inebriate me, water from the side of Christ, wash me. Passion of Christ, strengthen me. O good Jesus, hear me: hide me within your wounds and never let me be separated from you. From the wicked enemy, defend me, In the hour of my death, call me and bid me come to you, so that with your saints I may praise you for ever and ever. Amen (Anima Christi (14th Century)).
