Weekly Reflection...

Chapters 13-17 of John's Gospel are an extended body of teaching as Jesus prepares the disciples for life after his death and resurrection. In chapter 17 we are reminded once again that God is a God who sends: the Father has sent the Son into the world, and the Son now sends the disciples (John 17.18). The purpose of the Son being sent into the world was to 'dwell among' (John 1.14) or to 'be with' us. That 'being with' is continued through the disciples' ministry and, by extension, through each of us, called to 'be with' others in Christ's name.

First Reading

I will sprinkle you with clean water and put a new heart within you

I will take you from the nations, and gather you from all the countries, and bring you into your own land. I will sprinkle clean water upon you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you; and I will remove from your body the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. I will put my spirit within you, and make you follow my statutes and be careful to observe my ordinances. Then you shall live in the land that I gave to your ancestors; and you shall be my people, and I will be your God.

Second Reading

Casting of lots: Matthias is chosen

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people) and said, 'Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus— for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.' So one of the men who have accompanied us throughout the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection.' So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, 'Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

Gospel

Jesus prays for the protection and sanctification of his disciples

'I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.

Sunday's Cool Is Back! - It was great that Sundays Cool is back up and running **NEXT WEEK 19th May 2024**. Children will start off in church and then go to the Old School returning for communion. Other dates are 16th June, 30th June, 21st July, 15th September, 29th September, 20th October, and 17th November. We really want to demonstrate how committed we are to children and young families in this parish.

The **Deanery Confirmation Service** will take place on **Tuesday 11th June at 7.30pm** venue St Giles, Horsted Keynes. If you, or a member of your family, has not been confirmed and would like to be so (children must have been admitted to year 7) please let Fr. Daniel know. The preparation classes have started but are taking place at 4.00 pm on **8th May, 15th May, 22nd May, 29th May & 5th June**. Children who are in years 5 and 6 are not able to be confirmed in this diocese but can be **admitted to communion** after following a short and following a service of admission to take place at Holy Trinity (this will be arranged for June). If you would like you child admitted to communion, please see Fr. Daniel about this also so that we can get the preparation classes set up in the most convenient manner.

Your Next Steps in Ministry, if you are a settled member of the congregation, have you thought about what your next steps might be in your worshipping life. Please approach Fr. Children's Birthdays - from this month we want to start marking the birthdays of children who attend Holy Trinity by giving them a candle. If you have a child (under 13) please let Charlotte know their birthday so that we can make sure that it is marked and that nobody gets missed out.

Patronal Festival and APCM - Trinity Sunday 26th May 2024. The annual vestry and parochial church meeting will take place at 11.30 am, there will also be a champagne reception to celebrate Trinity Sunday, and a Festal evensong taking place that evening with a special setting being sung by the choir.

Holy Trinity is working to implement the **ChurchSuite** software for the Benefice. It has been adopted by more than 3,000 churches worldwide and the software provides a central repository for people, events, bookings, rotas, and groups and oversees communications by email and text (among numerous other things!). The parish calendar is already available via the website, and the Mailchimp mailing list for the newsletter is updated automatically from ChurchSuite. You are now able to login to **My ChurchSuite** - you can also find a link at the bottom of each newsletter. Enter your email address (this is the one to which the newsletter is sent). You probably do not yet have a password, so click 'Forgotten Password'; ChurchSuite will send you an email with a link to enable you to set a new password. You do not have access to all the features of ChurchSuite, but feel free to explore!

Praying through the week...

Mon May 13th - We pray for all involved in medicine, medical and social care. Tue May 14th - Matthias the Apostle.
