#### Weekly Reflection...

The passage from Mark 2:23-3:6, where Jesus reinterprets the Sabbath, can seem to conflict with Deuteronomy 5:12-15, where the Sabbath commandment is clearly laid out. Was Jesus breaking the law when he allowed his disciples to eat some crops or when he healed someone? In fact, these passages emphasise Jesus' role as an authoritative interpreter of the law, one who prioritises human need and compassion over rigid legalism. By positioning Jesus as Lord of the Sabbath, the passages assert his divine authority and introduce a new understanding of religious observance focused on mercy and human flourishing. Jesus' interpretation aligns with a deeper intention of the law, which is to benefit people. He argues that acts of mercy and necessity are consistent with the spirit of the Sabbath. This is seen in his statement, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath"

Observe the Sabbath and keep it holy

Observe the sabbath day and keep it holy, as the LORD your God commanded you. For six days you shall labour and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God; you shall not do any work you, or your son or your daughter, or your male or female slave, or your ox or your donkey, or any of your

livestock, or the resident alien in your towns, so that your male and female slave may rest as well as you. Remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the LORD your God brought you out from there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm; therefore the LORD your God commanded you to keep the sabbath day.

Second Reading 2 Corinthians 4.5-12

Our treasure is in jars of clay; glory belongs to God, not to us

For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness', who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you.

**Gospel** *Mark* 2.23-3.6

The Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath

One sabbath he was going through the cornfields; and as they made their way his disciples began to pluck heads of grain. The Pharisees said to him, 'Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the sabbath?' And he said to them, 'Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need of food? He entered the house of God, when Abiathar was high priest, and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and he gave some to his companions.' Then he said to them, 'The sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the sabbath; so the Son of Man is lord even of the sabbath.' Again he entered the synagogue, and a man was there who had a withered hand. They watched him to see whether he would cure him on the sabbath, so that they might accuse him. And he said to the man who had the withered hand, 'Come forward.' Then he said to them, 'Is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to kill?' But they were silent. He looked around at them with anger; he was grieved at their hardness of heart and said to the man, 'Stretch out your hand.' He stretched it out, and his hand was restored. The Pharisees went out and immediately conspired with the Herodians against him, how to destroy him.

#### Praying through the week...

**Mon Jun 3**<sup>rd</sup> - Remembering World Bicycle Day today we pray for all who are making efforts to improve safety for cyclists and pedestrians. We pray for all encouraging affordable, accessible and environmentally- friendly forms of transport, and exercise as part of promoting good health and well-being. We pray for all who maintain paths, cycle tracks and roadways. Locally we pray for the Independent State of Cuckfield, in all of the work that they do locally.

**Tue Jun 4th** - On this International Day of Child Victims of Aggression, we pray for the children living in wars across the globe, facing unspeakable horrors: unsafe sleeping in their homes, learning in school, seeking medical care at hospitals, or trying to escape danger. From killing and maiming, abduction and sexual violence, to attacks on education and health facilities, and the denial of the humanitarian assistance that they desperately need, children are being caught in the crosshairs of warring parties at a staggering scale. We pray for all in positions of leadership to bring to bear pressure to maintain humanitarian aid and save children. Locally we remember the people of Isaac's Lane and pray for their safety, health and well-being.

**Wed Jun 5**<sup>th</sup> - On this World Environment Day, we lament the lack of progress in reducing the more than 400 million tons of single- use plastic every year world-wide. An estimated 19-23 million tonnes end up in lakes, rivers and seas annually (approx. the weight of 2,200 Eiffel Towers all together). Microplastics find their way into food, water and air; it is estimated, each person on the planet consumes more than 50,000 plastic particles per year. Discarded or burnt single-use plastic harms human health and biodiversity and pollutes every ecosystem from mountain tops to the ocean floor. We pray that with available science and solutions to tackle the problem, governments, companies and other stakeholders scale up and speed actions to solve this crisis. May we too never lose sight of the part we play in reducing single -use plastic. Locally we pray for the people of Jeremy's Lane, that they find the welcome and support of a caring neighbourhood.

**Thu Jun 6**<sup>th</sup> - We pray for children and young people in the midst of the exam season. We pray that they are enabled to do the best they can, without being overwhelmed by anxiety; may they find whatever support they need. We pray too for teachers and schools and parents all needing to find the best ways to support and encourage. Locally we pray particularly for the people of Ledgers Meadow, that they may feel the joy of belonging and being valued.

**Fri Jun 7**<sup>th</sup> - On World Food Safety Day, we recognise that unsafe food is a threat to human health and economies, disproportionally affecting vulnerable and marginalised people, women and children, populations affected by conflict, and migrants. We pray for all those strengthening efforts to ensure that the food we eat is safe, that food safety is in the public agenda and to reduce the burden of foodborne diseases globally. Locally we pray for the people of Leyton Lea, for a neighbourhood of understanding, hospitality and care.

**Sat Jun 8**<sup>th</sup> - On World Oceans Day we give thanks for all that the oceans provide: habitat, beauty, energy, recreation, food... We pray for all depending on oceans for their livelihoods and all working to maintain a clean, healthy, unpolluted environment.

Locally we pray for all those working in healthcare, doctors, nurses, social care workers, that they may experience the love and kindness of others today.
