Weekly Reflection...

With the benefit of hindsight, it is easy to be astonished that Jesus' family thought he had gone mad and that the religious leaders of the day feared he might be working black magic. Jesus' response is addressed to all of them. The religious leaders must know that the devil does not undermine his own work, but his family also need to understand that a 'house divided against itself cannot stand'. It took his family a while to respond to that challenge, but Acts suggests that they did, in the end. In the meantime, Jesus extends the family to all who will build up, not pull down, the work of God.

First Reading Gen 3.8-15

God rebukes Adam and Eve and curses the serpent

They heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. But the LORD God called to the man, and said to him, 'Where are you?' He said, 'I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself.' He said, 'Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?' The man said. 'The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit from the tree, and I ate.' Then the LORD God said to the woman, 'What is this that you have done?' The woman said, 'The serpent tricked me, and I ate.' The LORD God said to the serpent, 'Because you have done this, cursed are you among all animals and among all wild creatures; upon your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life. I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike your head, and you will strike his heel.

Second Reading 2 Corinthians 4.13-5.1

But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture—'I believed, and so I spoke' we also believe, and so we speak, because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, because we look not at

what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal. For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

Gospel Mark 3.20-end

A divided kingdom cannot stand; my family are those who do God's will and the crowd came together again, so that they could not even eat. When his family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, 'He has gone out of his mind.' And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, 'He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons.' And he called them to him, and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but his end has come. But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his property without first tying up the strong man; then indeed the house can be plundered. 'Truly I tell you, people will be forgiven for their sins and whatever blasphemies they utter; but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit can never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin'— for they had said, 'He has an unclean spirit.' Then his mother and his brothers came; and standing outside, they sent to him and called him. A crowd was sitting around him; and they said to him, 'Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside, asking for you.' And he replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking at those who sat around him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever

Praying through the week...

Mon Jun 10th - International Day of Play (11th) We give thanks for the gift of play and for the gift of childhood; for all who encourage and enable children to enjoy play; for all who appreciate the importance of play: for learning, recreation and fun. We pray for those children denied their right to childhood and play, through harsh expectations and circumstances. We give thanks for all local shopkeepers, and pray that they may be conscious of the love and beauty around them.

Tue Jun 11th - On St. Barnabas Day we pray for all churches hospitals and charities dedicated to St. Barnabas Church and all the work based there. We pray locally for the people of Lodge Lane, that they may feel the comfort and presence of God.

Wed Jun 12th – Looking to the World Day Against Child Labour (12th), we pray for protection against child labour, greater access for children to education, and proper wages for adults, so there is less pressure or need for children to earn. We pray locally for the people of London Lane, that they may feel the richness of a community of respect, care and inclusivity,

Thu Jun 13th – International Albinism Awareness Day. Albinism is a rare, non-contagious, genetically inherited difference present at birth, leading to a vulnerability to the sun and bright light. Almost all people with albinism are visually impaired and prone to developing skin cancer. They also face discrimination due to their

skin colour; so they are often subject to discrimination on the grounds of both disability and colour. We pray for all living with genetic conditions and coping with health problems, social stigma and discrimination. Locally we pray for the people of Long House Lane, giving thanks for the ways in which they enrich the lives of the local community.

Fri Jun 14th We pray all those Standing in the General Election. Lord, grant wisdom, integrity, and guidance to the candidates. Bless voters with discernment. May peace, unity, and Your will prevail in this election. In Jesus' name, Amen. Locally, we pray for the people of Longacre Crescent, that they may have peace and joy in their hearts.

Sat Jun 15th – On World Elder Abuse Awareness Day we pray for all elderly people, remembering particularly those living in poverty, pain, with mobility issues, those feeling lost, confused or abandoned. We pray that elderly people around the world be treated with respect, dignity, patience, understanding and compassion. We remember the elderly people of our parish and neighbourhood and pray that we help them to live as independently as possible, in safety and dignity.
