Weekly Reflection...

The Gospel this Sunday recounts the story of Jesus calming the storm on the Sea of Galilee. The sudden and violent storm represents the unpredictability and danger faced by the disciples. Life for many of us can become unpredictable and dangerous. The disciples' reaction to the storm and Jesus' subsequent rebuke highlights the importance of faith, especially during difficult times. Their fear and panic contrast sharply with Jesus' calm and sleeping state. Jesus' question, "Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?" is a call for deeper trust and reliance on him. This message is timeless, urging Christians to maintain their faith and trust in God's providence even when faced with life's storms. It teaches that faith is not merely intellectual assent but a deep trust in God's presence and care, especially in moments of crisis.

Second Reading 2 Corinthians 6.1-13

Paul urges the Corinthians not to accept God's grace in vain

As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says, 'At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you.' See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labours, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honour and dishonour, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see—we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything. We have spoken frankly to you Corinthians; our heart is wide open to you. There is no restriction in our affections, but only in yours. In return—I speak as to children—open wide your hearts also.

Gospel Mark 4.35-end

Jesus calms the storm

FI. ' - 14/- - I

On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, 'Let us go across to the other side.' And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great gale arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, 'Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?' He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, 'Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?' And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?'

Praying through the week...

Mon Jun 24th - Marking International Widows Day (23rd) we recognise that, for many women around the world, the devastating loss of a partner is magnified by a long-term fight for their basic rights and dignity. We pray for the safeguarding and advancement of rights for widows, to counteract such things as land grabs and denial of inheritance rights after a husband's death. We pray for all who feel vulnerable, sorrowful and anxious having lost a life partner, that they may find the love and support of family, friends and community. We pray locally for the people of Mytten Bank, that they may feel heard, hopeful and valued.

Tue Jun 25th – On this Day of the Seafarer we pray for all who work or travel on or in the sea: for all who experience the dangers of extreme weather conditions, inadequate vessels and equipment or the threat of piracy: for all seeking to flee danger and find refuge across seas. We give thanks for such services as coast guards and the RNLI and their commitment to come to the aid of those in need at sea. We pray for the people of Mytten Close, that they may know the generosity and compassion of their community.

Wed Jun 26th –On this International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking we pray that stigma and discrimination cease and prevention is strengthened. We pray for all affected by drug abuse and trafficking, and pray that organisations established to support addicts in recovery and find ways to disrupt the exploitation of vulnerable people are made more robust, well maintained and are better supported. We pray for all who use and love them and for all who fight to preserve them for local access and enrichment. We give thanks for the access we have to walk in wild areas of our countryside and for those who fight to maintain and increase the right to roam. From our own parish we pray for the people of Old Park Close, for their health and welcoming, for their wellbeing and joy.
