On Remembrance Sunday, we honour those who have sacrificed, recalling their courage and commitment. In Mark 1:14-20, we see Jesus calling the disciples to leave behind their "nets" - their familiar lives, security, and traditions—to follow a new path of faith and purpose. Just as they were called to let go of their comforts, we are invited to reflect on what "nets" may hold us back from fully embracing God's kingdom. As we remember those who gave all, we are challenged to surrender our own fears, habits, or attachments, trusting God's call to a life rooted in hope and renewal.

First Reading

The people of Nineveh believe and God relents

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, 'Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you.' So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, 'Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!' And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth. When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

Second Reading

Christ appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sins by his own sacrifice

For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself. And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgement, so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

Gospel

Jesus begins his ministry and calls the first disciple

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.' As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake-for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fish for people.' And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.

Mon Nov 11th - We pray for all who work as builders, plasterers, decorators, electricians, roofers and plumbers. We pray for those working in trades we rely upon to maintain our buildings. We give thanks for their skills and dedication and pray for them in this difficult economic climate. Locally we pray for the people of Horsefield Green, that they may have a sense of being cherished, and that they too may feel able to be loving towards others this day.

Tue Nov 12th – We pray for our government and other world leaders. We pray for stability, for wisdom, humility, an ability to consult with and willingness to learn from colleagues. We pray for skills in governing, for compassion and respect for all who turn to our shores for asylum, for a commitment to all who live here, especially the most vulnerable. We pray locally for the people of Horsgate Lane that they may feel the richness of a community of respect, care and inclusivity.

Wed Nov 13th – We pray for all who feel vulnerable because of poverty, debt or inadequate housing. Sat Nov 16th - We look toward World Day for Remembrance of Victims of Road Traffic Accidents (17th) and pray for all whose lives have been affected by traffic accidents, all those who have lost loved ones in such accidents. We pray for all working to ensure road safety in terms of town planning, safety of vehicles, education of citizens and emergency services. We pray for the people of Jeremy's Lane, for their health and well-being, that they may feel drawn to acts of friendship and kindness this week.
