The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfil the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David; and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In those days Judah will be saved and Jerusalem will live in safety. And this is the name by which it will be called: 'The Lord is our righteousness.'

How can we thank God enough for you in return for all the joy that we feel before our God because of you?

Gospel Luke 21.25-36

The coming of the Son of Man in a cloud with great glory

There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in a cloud" with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.' Then he told them a parable: 'Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. 'Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.'

#### Praying through the week...

Mon Dec 2<sup>nd</sup> - Loving God, as we begin Advent, we pray for all who will visit Holy Trinity, Cuckfield. May they find blessing, peace, and joy in this sacred space. Prepare our hearts for Christmas, filling us with hope and love, so we may share your light with others in this holy season. Locally we pray for members of the Parish Council, for understanding, hospitality and care.

Tue Dec 3<sup>rd</sup> - Compassionate God, we pray for all in need during this season. Comfort the lonely, provide for the struggling, and bring peace to the weary. Inspire us to be your hands and heart, offering kindness and care to those around us, reflecting your love and generosity in this time of giving. We pray particularly for the members of the Cuckfield Society, that they may feel the joy of belonging and being valued.

Wed Dec 4th - We look towards 7th Dec and the International Day of Commemoration and Dignity of the Victims of the Crime of Genocide and of the Prevention of this Crime. We pray for all peoples who have been victims of such past and current crimes. We pray for all involved in rebuilding communities and nations, riven apart through the actions and language of genocide. We pray locally for Mothers Union, that they may have a sense of the wonder and diversity of God's creation.

Thu Dec 5<sup>th</sup> - On Dec 7<sup>th</sup> we remember Ambrose, Bishop, Doctor of the Church and patron of learning. We pray for all who work in mediation between factions, who work to bring about reconciliation between people, communities and countries. We pray that we may see that which is of God in everyone. Locally we pray for the people of Mount Noddy, that they find the welcome and support of a caring neighbourhood.

Fri Dec 6th - We remember Nicholas of Myra, early Christian bishop of Greek descent (4th Century). He is the source of our tradition of Santa Claus, due to his legendary habit of secret gift-giving. Another legend has it that he saved the lives of three condemned criminals by stopping the hand of the executioner. We pray for all living under a death sentence; for those who fight for justice and mercy; for those living in countries, where persecution, imprisonment without trial, unfair laws and practice are enforced. We pray for organisations like Amnesty International and Freedom from Torture campaigning for justice and compassion. Locally we pray for the people of Mytten Bank, that they may sense God's presence with them, whatever they are facing.

Sat Dec 7th - For all who have helped to organise and prepare the Christmas Tree Festival; for all working throughout the week, moving furniture, ensuring safety, helping with entertainment and refreshment, cleaning up afterwards; for all who will attend the festival; we pray for a smooth, successful and enjoyable event. Locally we remember the people of Mytten Close and pray for their safety, health and well-being.
