#### Reflection

The Feast of Christ the King invites reflection on the nature of kingship and the kind of leadership we choose to follow. In a world often marked by power struggles, corruption, and division, the figure of Christ presents a contrasting model of kingship. Jesus reigns not through force or coercion but through love, humility, and service to others. His kingdom is not of this world but embodies values of compassion, justice, and peace. Following Christ as King challenges us to look beyond worldly leaders and their often-self-serving agendas. It encourages us to embody Jesus's principles, such as love for our neighbours, care for the marginalised, and forgiveness. As we celebrate this feast, we are called to examine our lives and ask ourselves, 'What kind of king do I follow?'.

First Reading Daniel 7.9-10,13-14

Daniel's vision of the Son of Man

As I watched, thrones were set in place, and an Ancient One took his throne; his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool; his throne was fiery flames, and its wheels were burning fire. A stream of fire issued and flowed out from his presence. A thousand thousand served him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood attending him. The court sat in judgement, and the books were opened. As I watched in the night visions, I saw one like a human being coming with the clouds of heaven. And he came to the Ancient One and was presented before him. To him was given dominion and glory and kingship, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not pass away, and his kingship is one that shall never be destroyed.

even those who pierced him; and on his account all the tribes of the earth will wail. So, it is to be. Amen. 'I
am the Alpha and the Omega', says the Lord God, who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty.

Gospel John18.33-37

Then Pilate entered the headquarters again, summoned Jesus, and asked him, 'Are you the King of the Jews?' Jesus answered, 'Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?' Pilate replied, 'I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?' Jesus answered, 'My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here.' Pilate asked him, 'So you are a king?' Jesus answered, 'You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice.'

## Praying through the week...

**Mon Nov 25**<sup>th</sup> - On this International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women we remember all who are fearful of walking through the streets at evening time, all who are trapped in abusive relationships, all who are undermined in the workplace because they are women. **Tue Nov 26**<sup>th</sup> - In National Tree Week we give thanks for the part they play in keeping our air clean, combatting soil erosion, providing habitat for wildlife. We give thanks for our gardens, parks and the green spaces of our towns. We pray for all involved in the maintenance and upkeep of our national trees, gardens and parks. We pray that all can access and enjoy the benefits of such spaces. Locally we pray for the people of Long House Lane, that they may find the support, joy and strength they need in their lives.
