#### Reflection - The Rev'd David Tickner

When I was a young clergyman in the 1960s All Saints Day (1 November) and All Souls Day (2 November) felt very different. On All Saints Day we celebrated all the Saints who had taken up their place in Heaven. It was a very jolly occasion with processions, the best robes, incense, triumphant hymns and a general feeling that we were involved in a party. Often the service finished with a party! The following day we remembered the Departed with Requiem Masses with an atmosphere of solemnity and sorrow. Over the years it feels as though there has been a blending of All Saints and All Souls. Back in the 1960s many people had jobs that were mundane to say the least, but the Church could affirm their memory with the dignity they had from their Creator. Now it is much more likely that when we remember the departed, we will do so with thanksgiving for their life. Personally, I am more than happy to rejoice for the inspiration that has come to us from the special Holy Ones (Saints) but also to rejoice for the love and inspiration of people I have known who have taken a humbler route to Glory. Long live the 'blend'.

First Reading Isaiah 25.6-9

On this mountain the Lord will make a feast of rich food; the Lord we have waited for will save us

On this mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-matured wines, of rich food filled with marrow, of well-matured wines strained clear. And he will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that is spread over all nations; he will swallow up death for ever. Then the Lord God will wipe away the tears from all faces, and the disgrace of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken. It will be said on that day, Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, so that he might save us. This is the Lord for whom we have waited; let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation.

Second Reading Revelation 21.1-6a

The new heaven and the new earth, where every tear is wiped away

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, 'See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them; he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away.' And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new.' Also he said, 'Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.' Then he said to me, 'It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life.

Gospel John 11.32-44

The raising of Lazarus

When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, 'Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.' When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. He said, 'Where have you laid him?' They said to him, 'Lord, come and see.' Jesus began to weep. So the Jews said, 'See how he loved him!' But some of them said, 'Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?' Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. Jesus said, 'Take away the stone.' Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, 'Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead for four days.' Jesus said to her, 'Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone. And Jesus looked upwards and said, 'Father, I thank you for having heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me.' When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, 'Lazarus, come out!' The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, and let him go.'

#### Praying through the week...

**Mon Nov 4**<sup>th</sup>— We look to World Tsunami Awareness Day (5<sup>th</sup>) and pray for those 14 countries affected in the major global disaster of the Tsunami of 2004 and other countries prone to tsunamis. We pray that lessons have been learnt with evacuation routes updated, new warning systems installed and greater awareness raised among children and youth. We pray locally for the people of Hatchgate Lane, that they may have a sense of the wonder and diversity of God's creation.

**Tue Nov 5**<sup>th</sup> – We pray for all participating in firework gatherings, for safety, fun, wonder and community. We pray for the emergency services on hand at these times when accidents inevitably occur. We pray for all who are fearful because of the sounds, the smell of burning, the careless or vindictive actions of some. We pray too for our pets and the wildlife also scared on these occasions. Locally we pray for the people of Hatchlands, that they find the welcome and support of a caring neighbourhood.

**Wed Nov 6**<sup>th</sup> – International Day for Prevention of the Exploitation of the Environment during armed conflict and war. Though humanity has always counted its war casualties in terms of dead and wounded soldiers and civilians, destroyed cities and livelihoods, the environment has often remained the unpublicized victim of war. Water wells have been polluted, crops torched, forests cut down, soils poisoned, and animals killed to gain military advantage. We pray for all living with such a legacy and pray for the prevention of such exploitation and environmental destruction. Locally we pray for the people of High street, that they may sense God's presence with them, whatever they are facing.

**Thu Nov 7**<sup>th</sup> – We pray for all who work in our legal and justice system, and for fair access to legal aid. We pray for a lessening of the time it takes for cases to come to court – for the sake of victims, defendants and Justice. We pray for all who work in our courts, and for all imprisoned unjustly. Locally we remember the people of Hillside Walk and pray for their safety, health and well-being.

**Fri Nov 8**<sup>th</sup> – We remember all those who have been the victims of violence and pray that we learn to build a society which respects non-violence; we pray that we learn to resolve differences in ways that acknowledge the essential dignity and humanity of all. Locally we pray for Holy Trinity School, giving thanks for the ways in which they enrich the lives of the local community.

**Sat Nov 9<sup>th</sup>** – We look towards World Science Day for Peace and Development (10<sup>th</sup>) and give thanks for the ways in which collaboration between people of different countries can promote peace and can enable development to combat global problems. We pray for those scientists, researchers, governments and NGOs working for the benefit of our planet and all its inhabitants. Locally, we pray for the homeless, that they may have peace and joy in their hearts.
