Reflection

Luke pinpoints the exact moment in history when prophecy returns to a world shaped by tyrannical rulers. John, crying out in the wilderness, is the last of the great prophets preparing the way of the Lord. Echoing both Isaiah's words and Mary's themes in the Magnificat, John tells us that with the coming of the Lord the high will be brought down, the low raised up and injustices made right. John calls the people to repent because salvation is coming for all. They, and we, are to get ready to meet the Lord.

O Lord, raise up, we pray, your power and come among us, and with great might succour us; that whereas, through our sins and wickedness we are grievously hindered in running the race that is set before us, your bountiful grace and mercy may speedily help and deliver us; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit, be honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen**

First Reading Malachi 3.1- 4

The messenger is coming with refining fire: who can stand when he appears?

See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight—indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears?

For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.

Second Reading Philippians 1.3 -11

Paul prays for the Philippians, that they may produce the harvest of righteousness that comes through Christ

I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defence and confirmation of the gospel. For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight to help you to determine what is best, so that on the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

Gospel Luke 3.1 -11

John the Baptist is the one crying in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way of the Lord'

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah, 'The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth; and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."'

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor"; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.' And the crowds asked him, 'What then should we do?' In reply he said to them, 'Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do

Praying through the week...

Mon Dec 9th – We look back to 2nd December and the International Day for the Abolition of Slavery. We pray for all living still under the shadow of colonial slavery. We pray for all endeavouring to understand and resolve discussions and actions over the need and the possible means of reparation. We pray for all suffering from the current evil that is modern day slavery. Locally, we pray for the people of Newbury Lane, that they may have peace and joy in their hearts.

Tue Dec 10th - On Human Rights Day we remember the words of UN Secretary-General António Guterres "The Universal Declaration shows the way to common values and approaches that can help resolve tensions and create the security and stability our world craves." We pray for those who are denied basic human rights and all fighting to enable universal access to such. Locally we pray for Pains Flat giving thanks for the ways in which they enrich the lives of the local community.

Wed Dec 11th - We pray for all involved in health and medicine, all working to ensure universal and affordable access to good quality health care and medical services across the world. Fri Dec 13th – We pray for children in schools throughout Britain and elsewhere who will be involved in celebrations to mark Christmas; for all who are not able to attend school for whatever reason; for those who do not look forward to Christmas; for those who feel frightened, alone or unloved. May they experience some kindness and hope this Christmas. May we value the gift of giving. We give thanks for all who attend and work at Holy Trinity Primary School, Busy Bees Nursery and Cuckoos for a happy, inclusive, safe environment for all.

Sat Dec 14th We look towards the Christmas parties we give thanks for the joy, security and welcome that is experienced by parents, carers and children and that we continue to support and offer assistance to these groups. We give thanks for those who enable the groups to take place, the Christmas story to be told, a visit from Santa, Christmas celebrations to be enjoyed and fun to be had.
