#### Reflections

Historically, Mothering Sunday is the day when Christians visited the church where they were born into the family of faith through baptism. Quite rightly, it has become a day for honouring the mothers who gave us birth into the human family, and others who have showed us a mother's love - with an especial focus on Mary, the mother whose compassionate solidarity for all other mothers is heartfelt. It is a day to celebrate beginnings, to recall joy and laughter, to acknowledge painful journeys and to remember those who are no longer with us. Nowadays, we hear the language of motherhood applied also to the Earth, to Mother Nature. Perhaps her children take her for granted: she seems bountiful and vigorous, but now we also begin to see that she is not indestructible or inexhaustible.

God of compassion, whose Son Jesus Christ, the child of Mary, shared the life of a home in Nazareth, and on the cross drew the whole human family to himself: strengthen us in our daily living that in joy and in sorrow we may know the power of your presence to bind together and to heal; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The woman conceived and bore a son; and when she saw that he was a fine baby, she hid him for three months. When she could hide him no longer she got a papyrus basket for him, and plastered it with bitumen and pitch; she put the child in it and placed it among the reeds on the bank of the river. His sister stood at a distance, to see what would happen to him. The daughter of Pharaoh came down to bathe at the river, while her attendants walked beside the river. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her maid to bring it. When she opened it, she saw the child. He was crying, and she took pity on him. 'This must be one of the Hebrews' children,' she said. Then his sister said to Pharaoh's daughter, 'Shall I go and get you a nurse from the Hebrew women to nurse the child for you?' Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Yes.' So the girl went and called the child's mother. Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Take this child and nurse it for me, and I will give you your wages.' So the woman took the child and nursed it. When the child grew up, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and she took him as her son. She named him Moses, 'because', she said, 'I drew him out of the water.'

And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

#### Praying through the week...

**Mon Mar 31**<sup>st</sup> - We give thanks for our parks and gardens, our green spaces, waterways and woodlands. We give thanks and pray for all those who help to protect and sustain these places and all their inhabitants. We pray locally, for the people of Cuckfield Baptist Church, that they may have a sense of God's love and creation around them. **Tue Apr 1**<sup>st</sup> - On April Fools' Day, we give thanks for the gifts of fun, humour and laughter: for jokes, funny stories, harmless pranks, cartoons, the ability to laugh at ourselves. We pray that we may always be able to discern when our words or behaviour have stepped beyond the 'joke' into mockery, ridicule and hurt; we pray that we may always be sensitive to the feelings of others. Locally we pray for those who reside in Cuckfield Cottage Homes and for the Trustees.

**d Apr 2<sup>nd</sup>** - On World Autism Awareness Day we pray for all living with autism in a society that finds neuro-divergence challenging. We pray for greater awareness, understanding and celebration in our community of all manner of 'difference'. Locally we pray Cuckfield Dramatic Society, that they may sense God's presence with them, whatever they are facing.

**Thu Apr 3**<sup>rd</sup> - We give thanks for the creatures of our world. We give thanks especially for our pets. We pray for faithful, responsible care towards pets, for owners, for vets, for organisations promoting responsible ownership and good welfare of animals, and those supporting pet owners. We give thanks for the ways in which pets enrich our lives and pray for those who miss well-loved pets who have died. Locally we pray particularly Cuckfield Playgroup, all parents and baby groups, that they may feel the joy and pride of belonging to a community and being valued.

**Fri Apr 4**<sup>th</sup> - On International Mine Awareness day we recognise that mines and other explosive remnants of war continue to cause death and injury, in situations of armed conflict and for a long time afterwards. On average, one person is killed or injured by such explosive device every hour. We pray for the many children among the victims, for the citizens terrorised, and humanitarian aid and UN mission workers threatened by their continued use. We pray for all involved in Conflict prevention and peacebuilding. We pray locally for the people of Cuckfield Road, that they may have a sense of the wonder and diversity of God's creation.

**Sat Apr 5<sup>th</sup>** - We pray for refugees and asylum seekers around the world; for those forcibly displaced, often to areas unable to offer safety and security. We pray for those hoping to find welcome and hospitality in the UK; we pray for all working to maintain good positive relations between host and refugee communities; we pray for all reaching out in love and compassion and we pray for all who, often through difficulties of their own, are unable to see the call to 'love your neighbour as yourself.' Locally we pray for the people of Deak's Lane, for a neighbourhood of understanding, hospitality and care.
