#### Reflection

St Bartholomew, often identified with Nathanael, who's feast we mark today is introduced in the Gospels as a man of honesty and plain-speaking, brought to Jesus by Philip. Though at first sceptical, he soon recognises Jesus as Son of God and King of Israel, and later is found among the risen Lord's companions by the Sea of Galilee. Tradition remembers him as a faithful apostle and courageous preacher of the gospel, whose life bore witness to the healing, humility, and service seen in today's readings. His story reminds us that Christ calls and transforms ordinary people, drawing them into the joy and costly service of his kingdom.

### Worship this Sunday... Collect

Almighty and everlasting God, who gave to your apostle Bartholomew grace truly to believe and to preach your word: grant that your Church may love that word which he believed and may faithfully preach and receive the same; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

First Reading

Acts 5.12-16

The power of God works mightily through the apostles, bringing healing and wholeness in the name of

The power of God works mightily through the apostles, bringing healing and wholeness in the name of Jesus.

Now many signs and wonders were done among the people through the apostles. And they were all together in Solomon's Portico. None of the rest dared to join them, but the people held them in high esteem. Yet more than ever believers were added to the Lord, great numbers of both men and women, so that they even carried out the sick into the streets, and laid them on cots and mats, in order that Peter's shadow

might fall on some of them as he came by. A great number of people would also gather from the towns around Jerusalem, bringing the sick and those tormented by unclean spirits, and they were all cured.

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 4.9-15

Paul speaks of the costly calling of the apostles, whose weakness and hardship reveal the strength of Christ.

For I think that God has exhibited us apostles as last of all, as though sentenced to death, because we have become a spectacle to the world, to angels and to mortals. We are fools for the sake of Christ, but you are wise in Christ. We are weak, but you are strong. You are held in honour, but we in disrepute. To the present hour we are hungry and thirsty, we are poorly clothed and beaten and homeless, and we grow weary from the work of our own hands. When reviled, we bless; when persecuted, we endure; when slandered, we speak kindly. We have become like the rubbish of the world, the dregs of all things, to this very day. I am not writing this to make you ashamed, but to admonish you as my beloved children. For though you might have ten thousand guardians in Christ, you do not have many fathers. Indeed, in Christ Jesus I became your father through the gospel.

Gospel Luke 22.24-30

Jesus teaches that true greatness is found in humble service, just as he himself came among us as one who serves.

A dispute also arose among them as to which one of them was to be regarded as the greatest. But he said to them, 'The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those in authority over them are called benefactors. But not so with you; rather the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like one who serves. For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one at the table? But I am among you as one who serves. 'You are those who have stood by me in my trials; and I confer on you, just as my Father has conferred on me, a kingdom, so that you may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom, and you will sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel.'

#### Praying through the week...

**Mon Aug 25**<sup>th</sup> - We pray for all residential, care and nursing homes. We pray for all who work there: managers, carers, nurses, cooks, cleaners and those who maintain the buildings and grounds, and those who support the staff. We pray for skills, patience and compassion. We pray for all the residents and their families, that they feel affirmed, cared for, treated with dignity and respect. We pray for those who have been let down by inadequate or cruel words, behaviour or environment. Locally we pray for the people of Cherry Lane, that they may find joy, light in their lives.

Tue Aug 26th - We pray for all areas of the world, most vulnerable to the effects of climate change. We pray for greater UK and Western commitment to sustainability and disrupting the climate crisis. We remember those activists who have paid a high price in trying to disrupt us from our complacency, ending up with prison sentences for peaceful protest on our streets. We pray for all the threats currently experienced to Democracy in our own country. Locally we pray for the people of Chownes Mead Lane; may they be blessed.

Wed Aug 27th - On World Lake Day we give thanks for our lakes, rivers, reservoirs and waterways, for the ways in which they sustain and enhance lives and enrich our landscape. We pray for those areas which are polluted and those tasked with the clean-up. We pray for greater accountability and proper management from those with responsibility to provide us with clean and safe water. We pray locally for the people of Church Platt, that they may have a sense of the comfort and strength that comes from God.

Thu Aug 28th - We pray for all who are sick in body, mind or spirit; for those on the parish prayer list; for those known to us; for those who feel forgotten or alone. We pray for refugees and asylum seekers around the world, that they find welcome, safety and a home. We pray for those being displaced in their own homeland time after time. We pray for those, whose lives are put in danger as they are attacked, seeking aid in Gaza. We pray locally for the people of Church Street, that they may see something of God's love in their lives and in their community.

Fri Aug 29<sup>th</sup> - International Day Against Nuclear Tests. Since nuclear weapons testing began on 16 July 1945, over 2,000 have taken place. In the early days of nuclear testing little consideration was given to its devastating effects on human life, nor the dangers of nuclear fallout from atmospheric tests. Hindsight and history have shown us the terrifying and tragic effects of nuclear weapons testing, especially when controlled conditions go awry, and in light of the far more powerful and destructive nuclear weapons that exist today. We pray for those British military veterans and their families, still suffering from the effects of early testing and still awaiting acknowledgement and compensation. We pray for an end to nuclear testing. We pray for the people of Cleavers Lane, giving thanks for all that is good and hope in all those difficult areas of their lives.

Sat Aug 30th - On this International Day of the Victims of Enforced Disappearances, we recognise that this is frequently used as a strategy to spread terror within the society, affecting not only close relatives of the disappeared, but also their communities and society as a whole. Once largely the product of military dictatorships, enforced disappearances can nowadays be perpetrated in complex situations of internal conflict, especially as a means of political repression of opponents. We pray particularly for human rights defenders, relatives of victims, witnesses and legal counsel dealing with cases of enforced disappearance, who cope with ongoing harassment. We pray for an end to States using counter-terrorist activities as an excuse for breaching their obligations. We pray also for an end to the widespread impunity for enforced disappearance. We pray for the hundreds of thousands of people who have vanished during conflicts or periods of repression in at least 85 countries around the world. We pray locally, for those who volunteer at the Citizens Advice Bureau, that they may have a sense of God's love and creation around them, that they may feel God's loving presence.
